
STANDING VATION





The Central Iowa Wind Ensemble (CIWE) is an adult symphonic band with musicians drawn from the greater Des Moines area. Founded in 2003 by a group of central Iowa music educators under the leadership of Dr. Evan Feldman, CIWE has grown from its roots as a primarily educator ensemble into a vibrant group of musicians representing a wide range of backgrounds and professions.

In 2025, CIWE was honored as a **Bravo Greater Des Moines Spotlight Award Winner**, recognizing its artistic excellence and community impact. We are also proud that we are invited to be a featured performer at the 2026 lowa Bandmasters Conference. Other notable recognitions include performing under the direction of Colonel Jason Fettig, former conductor of "The President's Own" United States Marine Band, at the lowa Bandmasters Association Conference in May 2023, and an invited performance at the Regional Conference of the Association of Concert Bands in Omaha, Nebraska, in April 2024.

Each season, CIWE presents five public concerts along with special events, reaching audiences across Central lowa. The ensemble is committed to expanding access to high-quality live music by partnering with local human services agencies to engage underserved communities. CIWE also supports the next generation of musicians through its annual high school student solo competition, awarding cash prizes to outstanding young performers.

The Central lowa Wind Ensemble is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization registered as a corporation in the State of Iowa.

DR. CHRISTIAN CARICHNER

Artisitic Director & Conductor



Dr. Christian Carichner serves as the Associate Director of Bands and Director of the Cyclone Marching Band at Iowa State University. He oversees all aspects of the Athletic Band program including the 350-member lowa State University Cyclone Football 'Varsity' Marching Band, Men's and Women's Basketball bands. Volleyball Band, Wrestling Band and State Storm. In addition to his athletic band duties, Christian also teaches the Marching Band Methods course and instructs the applied Tuba and Euphonium studios. Previously, Christian served as Assistant Director of Bands at ISU in addition to instruction of the low brass studios. teaching low brass methods, and directing both the Concert and Campus bands.

While serving as director of the Cyclone Marching Band, the band was awarded the prestigious Sudler Trophy – the highest honor bestowed upon a collegiate marching band in the United States.

Christian attended Ithaca College where he earned degrees in music education and performance while studying tuba with Dave Unland and brass pedagogy with Alex Shuhan, as well as conducting studies with Stephen Peterson, Jeffery Grogan and Janet Galvan. After Ithaca, Christian earned a Master of Music degree in Tuba Performance from Arizona State University where he studied with acclaimed Tubist and pedagogue Sam Pilafian. Christian also studied tuba with Patrick Sheridan. Charles Villarrubia and Matt Good.

Christian has performed or taught in 47 states and 12 different countries across the globe. Recently, he was a clinician/presenter at The Midwest Clinic, the CBDNA Athletic Band Symposium and a performer/clinician at the International Tuba Euphonium Conference.

Christian has also performed with the Arizona Musicfest Orchestra, the Tampa Tradewinds, the Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes, Conway Symphony, Pinnacle Brass, Rhythm and Brass, Proteus 7, Salt River Brass and has performed with the national tour of the hit Broadway musical Chicago.

Christian served for many years as Brass Caption Head for the Phantom Regiment and The Academy Drum and Bugle Corps, as well as a lead brass instructor for the Aimachi Marching Band from Nagoya, Japan. Currently, he is in demand as a guest clinician, judge and show designer/arranger.

Christian is a member of CBDNA, Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Kappa Phi and the International Tuba Euphonium Association. He is an honorary member of both Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma. Christian is also the first marching brass artist for Pearl/Adams where he consults on the design of their marching brass instruments and is also an Adams Custom Brass artist.


JOHN BURNETT-LARKINS ANNOUNCER

A Most Wonderful Christmas

In this arrangement packed full with exuberance and sparkle, A Most Wonderful Christmas blends some of the most beloved tunes of the season into a vibrant and uplifting overture. Sheldon's masterful scoring captures the joy, warmth, and familiar cheer of holiday favorites, inviting listeners to settle in and celebrate the spirit of the season.

A Winter's Journey

Randall Standridge

This piece is a joyful, rhythmic celebration of winter travel and the people waiting at the other end of the road. Using the familiar melody of *Over the River and Through the Wood* as its foundation. The composer combined it with original material to create a fast-paced ride in a compound 12/8 meter — perfect for evoking the gallop of hooves, the jingle of bells, and the crisp energy of a snowy day.

The piece opens with a festive burst of momentum, full of active percussion, colorful scoring, and melodic moments for every section of the band. In the middle section, the mood turns more reflective and nostalgic — as if we're remembering winters past, warm fires, and familiar faces. Then, the music lakes off again, building to a triumphant and energetic finale.

Owens' lyrical and tender arrangement of Silent Night offers a moment of reflection and calm. Gentle orchestration and warm melodic writing bring out the carol's timeless message, allowing the ensemble to explore its most expressive and tranquil colors.

Nutcracker Fantasia

Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky arr. Julie Giroux

"This arrangement came about through an actual experience I had. I wanted to do a setting of some type of *The Nutcracker* ... which would include many of my favorites from the ballet — and not just the typical ones we hear in the Suite. To refresh my memory, I decided to watch the entire ballet. Somewhere during the performance I fell asleep. I blame my age. While I was sleeping, I was dreaming a few of the melodies in quite different settings. When I woke up, the ballet was still going. This experience serves as the premise for this chart.

We start out with a Godfather-like setting of *The Dance of the Sugar-Plum Fairies*, followed by *Waltz of the Flowers* done in two styles. First, that of a Rogers and Hammerstein-style waltz; then a slow Copland-ish setting. This concludes the fantasia (my dreaming) portion of this chart. The rest of it is literal, so literal that all the keys are the original keys from the composer's score."

It's atmospheric, cinematic, and uniquely captivating.

Snow on Snow

Inspired by winter imagery and poetic stillness, Snow on Snow envelops the listener in a soft, crystalline sound world. Vinther's writing gently layers motifs and harmonies, echoing the quiet accumulation of snowfall—a musical meditation on beauty, calm, and the delicate hush of winter.



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YOUTH BAND FESTIVAL FOR 5th-6th GRADERS



In April, the Central Iowa Wind Ensemble (CIWE) will launch its first-ever Elementary Band Festival and Composer-in-Residence Program, an exciting new initiative that will engage nearly 200 5th- and 6th-grade students from across Central Iowa. These young musicians will come together for a full day of rehearsing, collaborating, and performing under the direction of two nationally known composers, **Laura Brittin Chambers** and **Peter Thompson**. An additional 250 students will benefit from on-site school workshops, where they will meet and work directly with Ms. Chambers who will conduct one of her own compositions. This experience not only elevates the students' musical learning but also expands CIWE's educational impact far beyond the festival stage.

GUEST CONDUCTOR AND COMPOSER-IN-RESIDENCE: CAROL BRITTIN CHAMBERS

This inaugural festival will feature renowned composer Carol Brittin Chambers, current owner and lead composer of Aspenwood Music (aspenwoodmusic.com). Chambers is widely respected in the band world as a highly sought-after conductor, composer, and clinician, known for her colorful writing, engaging educational works, and dynamic collaborations with student musicians. She lives in San Antonio, Texas, where she serves on the music faculty at Texas Lutheran University, teaching composition and serving as Composer in Residence. Her expertise, energy, and passion for music education make her an extraordinary mentor for the hundreds of lowa students participating in this year's festival.

GUEST CONDUCTOR AND COMPOSER: PETER THOMPSON

CIWE is also proud to feature Peter Thompson, a respected lowa music educator and the creator of Amplified Warmups, a widely used resource in school band programs. Thompson has spent eighteen years with the Ames, lowa band program, including thirteen years as the lead instructor for 6th grade band, three years assisting at Ames High School, and currently serving as the lead instructor for 8th grade. His ensembles are highly regarded, and in 2024 his group was honored with a performance at the lowa Bandmasters Association state conference, one of the highest recognitions in the field. Thompson brings a deep understanding of young musicians, a passion for innovative teaching, and a valuable lowa-based perspective to this year's festival rehearsals.
